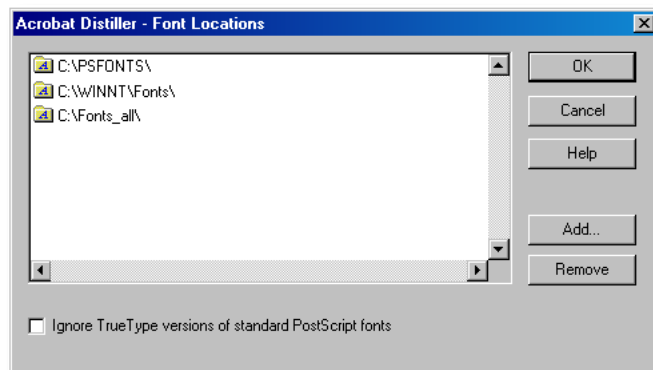
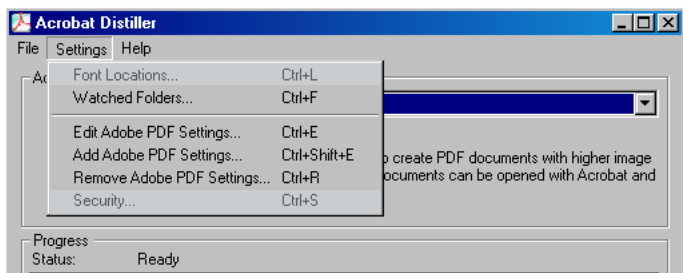

OPI High Quality Settings

This document gives you the best settings for creating a PDF file for output at Odyssey Press Inc. (OPI) using Distiller.

Whether you are on a Mac or Windows platform the Adobe Distiller application works in about the same way. We'll give you a few examples of the windows you will see on either platform. These windows also show the settings we would prefer you use.

- Download the **OPI High Quality Distiller settings.zip** archive to your desktop and decompress it.
- Launch your Distiller application and check to make sure your application is pointing to all of your font locations. The window will look something like this:



- Make sure that your security settings are off! This is important. If any security is applied, OPI will not be able to make requested changes or corrections to your file—or may not be able to print it! Once you have checked font locations and security, you are ready to add the OPI High Quality settings.

Adding Job Options Using the Menu

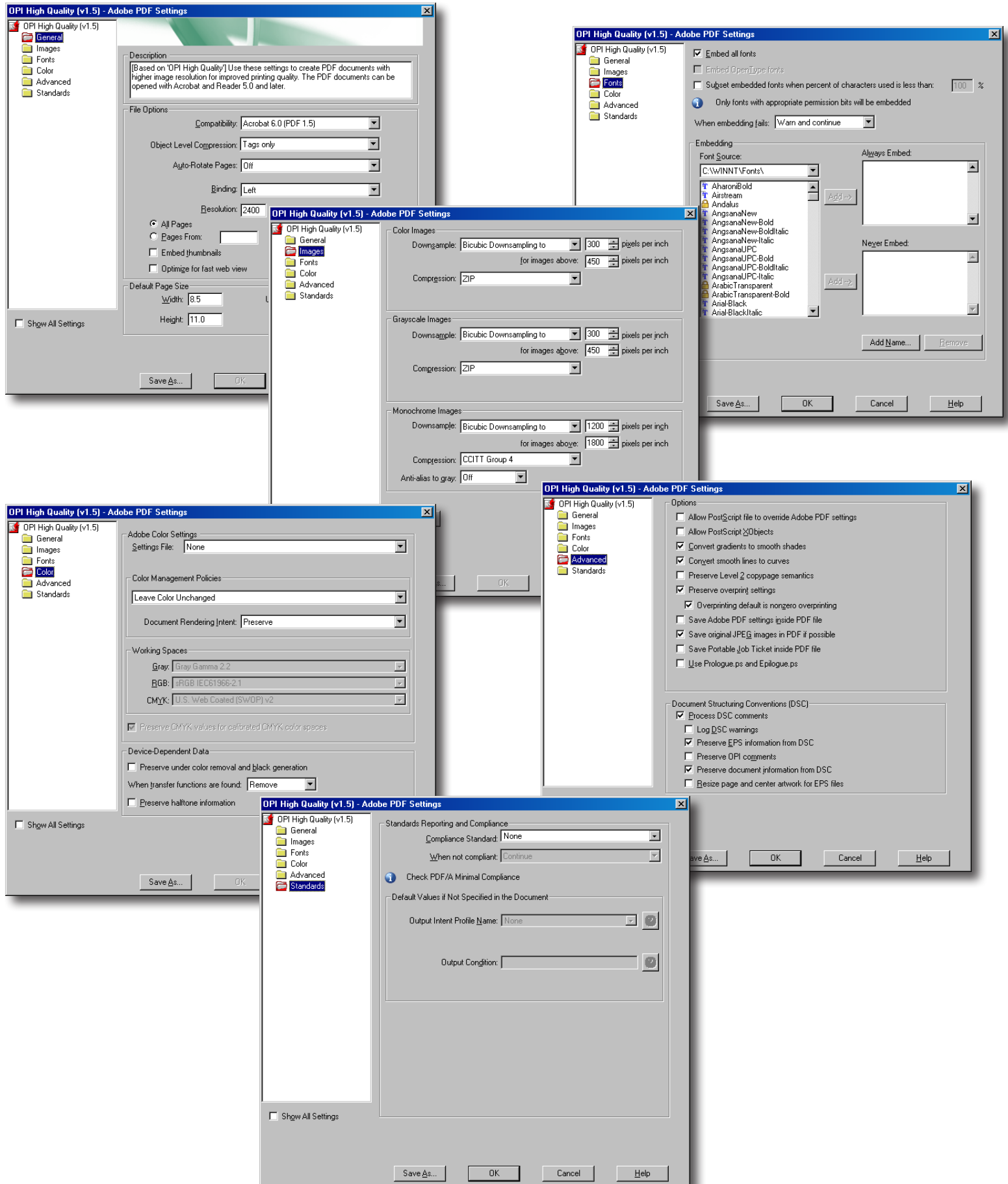
The easiest way to add the settings file is using the menu. This method works on either the Mac or the PC.

1. From the **SETTINGS** menu
2. Choose: **Add Adobe PDF Settings...**
3. Navigate to the **OPI High Quality Dist~.joboptions** file for your version of Distiller.
4. Click **OPEN** and your settings are now available and saved in the proper location. You can safely delete the downloaded files.

If you would prefer to enter the settings yourself, use the pictures on the following pages as a guide.

If you are still using Distiller 5 the best way to create the OPI High Quality settings is to choose the "Press" setting from the drop-down menu then go to the Settings menu and choose **Job Options**, select or deselect settings under each tab to match those below. Once you have done that, choose **Save As...** and name your settings "OPI High Quality."
